




## **Confirmation Year 2**

Welcome to your second year of the Confirmation Preparation here at Saint Ambrose! Your small group leaders and I look forward to walking with you on your journey over the coming months.



#### A Glance at the Upcoming Year

So you may be wondering what this year will hold. Below are the two types of nights we will have for you that you are asked to attend. These are all nights where we hope you will encounter the Lord in a very real and personal way this year.

<u>Confirmation Large Group</u>: Large Groups are nights where both Year I and Year II Confirmation classes come together to listen to a speaker talk about a topic within the context of our Catholic faith. During these nights we will also have opportunities to encounter God in Sacred Scripture, in Eucharistic Adoration and Reconciliation.

<u>Confirmation Small Group:</u> Confirmation small group nights are an opportunity to meet with your peers and you are expected to attend these as well as the large group sessions. At these small group nights we will take a deeper look on how to live your faith more effectively. During Confirmation small group you will have time for prayer, a short Bible study, listen to and discuss the topic of the evening, as well as have a personal life check in with your Small Group.

**Bringing Sponsors:** We ask that your sponsor attend the **Confirmation rehearsal**.



#### The Role of the Candidate

#### A Confirmation Candidate...

- Is open to participating in the Confirmation preparation process of prayer, retreats, communal celebrations, and small group sessions sharing thoughts, ideas, and concerns with one another.
- Joins his or her peers and community volunteers in small group sessions, and large group activities.
- Treats all participants with respect and brings an open, serving attitude to small/large group gatherings and ministry activities.
- Pursues a deeper knowledge of the Catholic Faith and actively participates in all sessions.
- Actively practices his or her faith, in home, school, and throughout his or her life.
- Celebrates Mass with the community and receives the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation regularly.
- Is individually responsible for completing all aspects of the process.
- <u>Freely</u> chooses to be confirmed and makes his or her desire known by writing a letter of request for Confirmation to the Pastor.
- Is committed to <u>continuing</u> the faithful practice and study of his or her religion and pursues a
  deeper relationship with God after being confirmed.

#### Retreats

You are required to complete at least one Retreat opportunity before completing your Sacrament of Confirmation preparation. A retreat is a time for you to get away and spend time with the Lord as you further your relationship with Him. You are only asked to attend one retreat during Year II preparation.

**When are the Retreats?** You have the choice of attending the High School retreat that works best for your schedule. If neither of these works, contact David for other options.

**Where are the Retreats?** The retreats will be held at Camp Victory which is located near Zumbro Falls, Minnesota.

How do I attend a Retreat? There is information on how to sign up for the retreats in this handbook.

If you do not attend one of the scheduled Saint Ambrose retreats, you will need to attend a retreat that you have notified us that you are attending and you will need to have that organization contact us after you have completed the retreat.

#### **Confirmation Name**

Candidates for Confirmation choose certain saints for a variety of reasons. One major reason is that the saint is someone they aspire to be like. For some, this person is someone they always thought had a cool story. Maybe you heard a great story about some saint and thought you would like to be more like this person, that's what so many other candidates for Confirmation have done as well!

A good strategy to go about this whole process is to pray about and reflect on what God is calling you to in life. Maybe you have identified particular gifts or passions that you have and those could very well be an indication of what God could be calling you to as a vocation. Maybe you really enjoy serving the homeless or helping out young people, there is a saint for that! Maybe you really like playing sports or hiking, there is a saint for that! From people who were in the times of the Roman coliseum who were slain for their faith to people who would reject money and gifts to live a simple life for the Lord, Heaven is rich with saints.

Often times we have a tendency to look at portraits, paintings, or statues of saints and think that this person lived a good life, but now they are gone. But if we really think about it they aren't gone because there is eternal life when we pass from this world. Because these people have proclaimed Jesus as Lord of their life and dedicated themselves to proclaiming the Gospel by helping others know God and attain salvation they are honored and recognized by the Church for ages to come. They are alive and you have the amazing opportunity to pursue a unique relationship with one of these saints in choosing to be named after one of them.

It's hard to be a Christian today. People persecute our faith all over the world. Churches are being burned down and young people are being ostracized from their friends for believing in God. This is not something new. Catholics for over 2000 years have been persecuted, beaten, and even killed because they dare to believe in Jesus Christ. These people who have gone on before us have lived some of the most courageous lives that this world will ever see. These people stared death in the eyes and knelt down only to Christ. They are the same people who will never leave your side and they will be praying for you and with you for the rest of your life, because that is what Christ, whom they lived and died for, does for all of us.

So, do some research, ask a spiritual mentor for advice, and take time to pray to God for guidance in choosing a saint name and choose the saint that inspires you to live your life for Him.

#### **Confirmation Sponsor**

Spending time with a sponsor during the Confirmation process is a valuable opportunity for one-on-one faith sharing. Sponsors assist the candidates by sharing in a close way his or her faith journey and preparation for Confirmation and encourage the candidates to live as a true witness of Christ. Besides attending the Rite of Confirmation itself, the sponsor will attend three Large Groups sessions with the candidate during Year 2 of the Confirmation process. Your sponsor needs to be over the age of 16 and already confirmed and they **cannot** be one of your parents.

#### Sponsor Role & Responsibilities

- A sponsor must be a practicing Roman Catholic who has been fully initiated him/herself through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist and leads a life in harmony with the Catholic Faith.
- May be a Baptismal Godparent, thus emphasizing more clearly the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation.
- Be sufficiently mature in his/her own faith commitment.
- Support the candidate in his/her commitment to a Christian life.
- Get to know the candidate and be willing to serve as a strong and long-lasting Christian influence on the candidate.
- Encourage the candidate by prayer and action to live their life more fully for Christ.

#### Choosing a Sponsor

Choosing a Confirmation Sponsor can be a really great experience. The best way to go about choosing a Confirmation Sponsor is to look at the kind of person who really inspires you to live out your faith. A Sponsor is someone that you can walk this Confirmation journey with. Someone who will help you learn about the faith and challenge you to grow in a unique way to give more of yourself to Jesus and His Church. In a lot of ways, choosing a sponsor is a lot like choosing a Confirmation saint. You want to select a role model, an influential figure who chooses to live for God and not the fleeting world. I would encourage you to really pray about this decision and seek out your parents and ask them what they think about your selection. You definitely will want to choose a sponsor who is someone that you feel comfortable talking with, and is available to meet with you regularly throughout the year. Generally, it is best if sponsors live in the Twin Cities area so that you can meet regularly. It might be helpful to go over the sponsor role and responsibilities above when looking through potential sponsors.

A sponsor for Confirmation accompanies the candidate through the preparation on behalf of the faith community. He/she must be a practicing Roman Catholic who has been confirmed and has received the Blessed Eucharist, and leads a life in harmony with the Faith. According to the directives of Canon 874, NO. 5, neither the father nor the mother of the candidate can be a sponsor.

Choose someone who will be available and willing to help you, whom you admire, trust, and can talk to easily, and who will be actively involved with you for a year. If your Sponsor cannot come to the large group meetings then we encourage you to identify an adult other than your parent to participate in the Sponsor/Candidate sessions.

#### Sponsors are asked to:

- Get to know YOU and your journey.
- Discuss your progress & do follow-up activities with you at home for the Confirmation sessions and faith sharing.
- Help you write your Letter of Request to the Pastor.
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation with you before Confirmation.

#### **Letter of Request for Confirmation**

One of the requirements for Confirmation is that each candidate writes a letter of request. The purpose of the candidate's letter is to share with us why you would like to be confirmed in the Catholic Church. Writing your letter can be a positive experience in helping you organize and express your feelings and ideas about being confirmed. This letter is addressed to Father Peter Williams, the Pastor.

#### In your letter of request you will:

- State weather or not you would like to be confirmed.
- Express why you want /don't want to be confirmed in the Catholic Church.
- Sate why you believe you are properly/improperly disposed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

#### It is also important to think about and answer the following questions:

- What is most important to you about being Catholic?
- What do you feel is the most difficult part of being a Catholic teen and why you believe it is still worth being a Catholic teen?
- How have you participated in the activities asked of you by the St. Ambrose parish?
- What has been the most meaningful part of your preparation of Confirmation and why?
- How has your personal relationship with God grown?
- How do you feel you have matured as a Christian in the last year?

#### Don't forget...

- · Begin the letter with, "Dear Father Williams,"
- Sign the letter with your full name (first and last)
- Please use spell check and please have a friend or parent proofread your letter to catch any errors.
- Please type your letter and divide your writing into multiple paragraphs so it is easily read.
- Please send a copy to your Sponsor as they are the ones walking closest with you on this

#### Confirmation Interviews Notes and Info



<u>Purpose of Interviews</u>: To help candidates grow closer to God and their parents and sponsors through having conversations about faith and life.

Encouragement for Parents and Sponsors: During your interview, please ask your teen/candidate for some of their answers to the same questions you are receiving. In other words, use this opportunity to help you get to know one another better.

#### <u>Tips/Guidelines for Completing Interviews:</u>

- 1. Each of your interviews will take some time. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE TO DO THESE. Rather, schedule a date and time for each of your interviews well in advance of their due dates.
- 2. All interviews must be spoken in real time\* and should take place in person\*\*.
  - —Students should NOT simply text or e-mail questions and get typed out responses sent back. We want to ensure communication on a real, human level.
  - —If a sponsor is in another state and cannot do the interview in person, a phone or Skype call will suffice.
- 3. Students should summarize the answers they receive on the interview sheets provided (bullet-pointed answers are just fine). Two main ways this can happen:
  - —Option 1: Students ask questions, then write down answers they hear as they go through each question.
  - —Option 2: Students ask questions while recording the interview on some kind of a device. Then, later, they play back the interview and either write or type down their answers on the interview sheet.
- 4. All interview answers will be kept confidential and will NOT be saved by the Confirmation Coordinator. They will merely be check for completion. If I suspect that the interview was not conducted properly (overly brief summary of answers on the sheet, for instance) then I may e-mail or call parents/sponsors to confirm that the interview took place and then ask the student to rewrite their answer summaries on the sheets.
- 5. The parent interviews are for both mom and dad. Students can interview parents together or separately, but students should record answers for both parents. If a special circumstance prevents both parents from being interviewed, please contact David Flynn so accommodations can be made.
